- 1. United Way Board Chair Matt Humphreys called the 68th Annual Meeting of the Membership to order at 8:01 a.m. in person and virtually with a quorum present.
- 2. The minutes of the March 21, 2025 Board of Directors Meeting were approved as presented.
- 3. COO Hannah Pelle presented the United Way Partnership Award to Dr. Tanya Benford in recognition of more than a 15-year partnership that has empowered students and enriched our community through education and action. Their innovative collaboration through the VITA Program, now an integral part of the business law curriculum, ensures that every student earns a VITA certification as part of their academic journey.
- 4. Chief Human Resources Officer Connie Boyd announced a new hire, employee anniversaries and recent promotions. Tyheim Archbold is our new 211 Data and Technology Manager and has a background in computer systems. Promotions included Christina Grimm who was promoted to First Responder Ambassador Lead, Ashley Lisea to Clinic Community Resource Specialist Lead, and Madison Mitchell to Senior Vice President of Community Impact and Disaster Response.
- 5. President and CEO Jeannine Joy reviewed the Anti-Discrimination Policy. While the overall structure remains the same, the language has been updated to reflect clearer terminology. The policy was approved as presented.
- 6. President and CEO Jeannine Joy conducted the annual review of the United Way Worldwide Membership Standards. Minimal updates were noted, including the planned completion of



Database 2 by the June 30 deadline and updates related to the Thriving United Way initiative. The Standards were approved as presented.

- 7. Performance Indicators for 2024–2025 were distributed and accompanied by a digital media summary presented during the meeting. Department Heads highlighted notable achievements and insights from the past year, underscoring their contributions to organizational success. President and CEO Jeannine Joy acknowledged that while the departments of Grants/Contracts, Finance/Pledge Processing, and HR/Facilities were not featured in the Impact Report, they remain essential to our operations and serve as a vital asset to our organization. Achievements for those departments were shared. The report was unanimously approved as presented.
- 8. Secretary Mary Vlasak Snell proudly announced the 30th anniversary of Jeannine Joy's dedicated service. In recognition of this milestone, the Board of County Commissioners presented a formal Proclamation honoring her outstanding contributions. A letter from United Worldwide President Angela Willliams was presented in honor of the occasion. Accompanying it was a thoughtful token of appreciation from our United Way. President and CEO of United Way of Florida sent a video of thanks and congratulations.
- 9. 

- 10. President and CEO Jeannine Joy extended heartfelt appreciation to outgoing Board Chair Matt Humphreys for his dedicated leadership and presented him with a commemorative token of gratitude. In turn, Matt expressed his sincere thanks to the membership for their continued support. The Annual Meeting of the Membership was adjourned at 9:05 a.m.
- 1. Newly elected Board Co-Chair Kevin Karnes called the Board Meeting to order at 9:06 a.m. via a hybrid meeting with a quorum present.
- 2. President and CEO Jeannine Joy provided an update on the Elevate Leadership Program and extended congratulations to the inaugural graduating class. Special thanks were offered to FineMark National Bank & Trust for graciously hosting the graduation ceremony and luncheon. Graduates included Angela Fischler, Fifi Carrillo, Jenn Carolluzzi, Craig Norling, and Claudia Portalatin. Jeannine noted that a highlight of the program was the quarterly book discussions with board members. The incoming class for this year features Marissa Crawford, Lissette Ortiz, and Carlos Prado.
- 3. President and CEO Jeannine Joy introduced the Thriving United Way Assessment, an initiative launched by United Way Worldwide for United Ways. The initiative focuses on strengthening partnerships and diversifying funding sources. Jeannine reflected on our organization's six-year journey toward funding diversification and internal program expansion, emphasizing that this assessment will help highlight both strengths and areas for growth. Beginning in August, participation from 10 board members will be needed to support the process. The board approved the initiative as presented.



- 4. Following a presentation by Chair of the Fund Distribution Committee, Tom Uhler, three action items were discussed: (1) Adjust The Salvation Army's overall 2025 United Way funding from \$344,800 to \$334,800; a decrease of \$10,000 because they did not utilize their direct assistance funds in Hendry/Glades. (2) Approval of the recommended agency funding for 2026 in the amount of \$9,690,839 in accordance with the proposed Executive Summary distributed and attached at the end of the minutes. (3) Recommendation that the 2025-2026 Campaign Goal be set at \$11,512,716. The three items were approved as presented. Tom Uhler was recognized for his outstanding 30-year contribution to our Fund Distribution Team, a testament to his dedication and impact over the decades.
- 5. 2025-2026 Campaign Co-Chair Will Prather was introduced and shared how excited he was to participate this year and noted that the roll-out of the Pacesetters is August 4 at Broadway Palm Dinner Theatre. 2024-2025 Campaign Co-Chairs, Scott Nygaard and Dan O'Berski, were thanked for their leadership and successful campaign.
- 6. President and CEO Jeannine Joy provided the upcoming meeting schedule and requested any contact information updates. Board Members will be receiving the annual Conflict of Interest Policy, Confidentiality Form, and Self Identification via email soon.
- 7. United Way Board Co-Chair Kevin Karnes thanked the Board and the staff for everything they do to help the community and FineMark National Bank & Trust for graciously hosting our meetings. The next meeting will be virtual on August 1, 2025. The meeting was adjourned at 9:32 a.m.
